Stand up straight. Look people in the eye. Brush/comb your hair. Have a firm handshake. Don't chew gum. Don't slouch when you sit or walk. Shine your shoes. Press your shirt and pants, clean and freshen your clothing. Dress for success....not a night out with friends. Don't eat garlic before an interview. Basic and wise counsel for those seeking any job or volunteer position. While many initial employment queries are now done via the internet, eventually face to face contact between an applicant and an employer will occur...and then the competition begins. With similar credentials or background histories, the deciding factor as to who gets the job-nod frequently comes down to how the applicant has presented themselves...as compared to everyone else. While we are not competing against one another for God's love (there is plenty of it to go around), a PURPOSEFUL and INTENTIONAL RELATIONSHIP with Father, Son or Holy Spirit is essential. Relationships with Jesus (like all relationships) require commitment, hard work, time, sacrifice and time. So...if you want eternal bliss.... 'feed the hungry, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, do unto others as you would have done to you, forgive, be generous....' those are the keys to heavenly success and eternal life. Or don't...but then don't be surprised when there is 'wailing and grinding of teeth'...because some who have thought they would be first will be last...and some who have been resigned to being last, will be first.
