‘STOP MURMURING among yourselves.’

When a group of people get together and start talking and offering opinions about something of which they DON'T KNOW anything...it is called, POOLED IGNORANCE...but it is neither suitable for a refreshing swim nor a stimulating dunk on a hot day. Societally, for example, we are experiencing a lot of this as people 'pool' their misguided notions of whether the Covid pandemic is 'real' or not....the families of the 627,000+ Covid-related DEAD Americans certainly know the virus to be real and not a fabrication. In this weekend's Gospel, the people of Jesus' day struggled with his self-claiming to be THE LIVING BREAD OF LIFE, to be sent FROM GOD. They THOUGHT they knew what they knew...but had a difficult time expanding their minds to accept that God could be physically, personally, encountering them in the PRESENCE and REALITY of Jesus. As participants within our society, while most of us profess an INTERIOR embrace of Jesus as the Son of God.... does it extend beyond the one hour we spend at Mass? Are we OPEN...and waiting.... to encountering Jesus in OTHER aspects of our day, sometimes within the people surrounding us, in our thoughts, in our dreams? While we say OUT LOUD, in our Creed, 'I BELIEVE....in One God....in Jesus Christ...in the Holy Spirit.... do our actions....OUTSIDE of Mass demonstrate our BELIEFS?
